Students in KSYK in 2025-26

- In the 25-groups, a total of 180 students started:
 - a and b: general stream
 - c: social sciences and economics stream
 - d: science and technology stream
 - e and f: English stream
- In the 24-groups: 182 students
 - A new student in groups a and c + students returning from exchange will be in groups c and e.
- 23-22 seniors (graduating students): 186+38 students
- 7 exchange students (24e+f) from Canada, Denmark, Italy, Spain, USA, Japan, Germany
- Upper secondary school altogether: 591 students
- Middle school: 596
- All students together: 1187
- Staff members 115

Operational culture and community

- Each period has its own theme; the theme of the first period is operational culture and community
- Getting acquainted and reviewing school procedures at the start of the academic year
 - Let's make sure no one is left on their own
 - Everyone prevents bullying
 - Let's give others the chance to focus on their schoolwork.
 - Let's remove distractions from our own work.
 - Let's learn the skills of working together.
 - Let's support each other, not compete against each other



Changes in Practices for the 2025-2026 School Year

Use of Phones and Mobile Devices > Amount of Screen Time

- Following the amendment to the Basic Education Act, the entire school's rules regarding the use of mobile devices have been updated for upper secondary school students as follows:
 - **During lessons,** computers are used according to the teacher's instructions, and phones are used only if there is a specific need and permission.
 - Phones or other mobile devices are not to be used in the school library.
 - If lunch takes place during the middle school's lunch shift (11:00 AM 12:00 PM), the use of mobile devices in the cafeteria is prohibited
 - We recommend that mobile devices are also not used during the upper secondary school's lunch period

Rules for Using Artificial Intelligence

- Al serves as a support for learning, not a substitute for it
- Follow the teacher's instructions
- Be transparent about your use of AI
- Use the AI services recommended by the school
- Remember data protection and copyrights

Reform of Learning Support in Upper Secondary Education 2025

Support for learning as Part of Upper Secondary School Studies

- Group-based support for everyone: Math and Finnish "cafés", a Swedish study support unit, and a maths study support unit for first-year students
- Provided to the student as soon as a need for support arises -> prevention of accumulating difficulties
- Individual support for learning is intended for students who have difficulty passing a study unit or the syllabus of a subject, or whose studies are not progressing
- It can be given to a student who has temporarily fallen behind in their studies or needs support for another reason. It is not provided if the reason is unexcused absences and/or extra vacations
- Forms of support can also include instruction given by a subject teacher and a special education teacher, as well as support and guidance from the special education teacher, study advisor, and other staff
- The student has the right to receive support but also the right to refuse it

Going forward, special education will be available in upper secondary school

A student has the right to special education if the learning support described previously is insufficient and they require special education due to diagnosed learning difficulties or another comparable reason


Upper Secondary studies

- Upper Secondary studies are 150 credits
- The scope of the syllabus is three years, but it can be extended to 3.5 or 4 years.
- High school studies consist of national compulsory and optional courses, as well as school-specific optional courses.
- The studies are divided into course units, which range from 1-3 credits in scope.
- There are 5 periods in an academic year, with an assessment week at the end of each.
- The matriculation examination is completed during high school.
 - 5 compulsory exams.
 - Must be completed within a maximum of three consecutive examination periods.

Selecting courses

- First-year course selections have been made.
 - Changes are possible throughout the year.
 - 60-66 credits per year is the recommended course load.
 - The school's maximum is 76 credits per year.
- Students create a personal study plan under the guidance of a Guidance Counsellor
- Next year's course selections and the matriculation examination plan are made in February-March.
- Changes to the study plan are made with the Guidance Counsellor



Changes in the study plan - level of study

Subject Levels and Changes

- A-mathematics (advanced/long), B-mathematics (basic/short).
- A-language (advanced/long syllabus), **B1-language** (intermediate syllabus, Swedish), **B2- and B3-languages** (short syllabus).
- Level changes such as switching from the advanced to the basic syllabus are done with the Guidance Counsellor
- Credits for previously completed studies can be transferred.
- These choices impact further education and future career paths.

Finnish Language

- Finnish is offered as **S1** (mother tongue) or **S2** (Finnish as a second language).
- Placement is generally based on the student's final certificate from comprehensive school.
- The decision is made by the Finnish teachers based on criteria from the Matriculation Examination Board (YTL).
- A possible change between S1 and S2 can be made during the first academic year.
